Leaving a gift in your Will to Yeovil Hospital

Leaving us a gift in your Will gives you a chance to make a lasting difference. Just like our doctors and nurses, you will be helping people at a time when they need it the most.



Legacy gifts provide the extra funding we need to update our facilities, buy the latest life-saving equipment and develop new services for patients.

- A specific gift - this can be property, stocks and shares or other valuables such as a piece of jewellery.
